Our Home and School Association works very hard each year to fundraise in order to support the school. They provide funding for so many programs that are not included in the regular school budget due to financial constraints.

H.S.A funds completely support our extracurricular athletics. We offer golf, soccer, field hockey, basketball and lacrosse for grades fifth through eighth. Of course these teams need uniforms and equipment. Additionally, we must secure fields for games and practices as well as referee fees. Both of these are very costly.

This organization has generously provided teachers with much needed money to purchase items for their classrooms. These supplies enable teachers to differentiate and create engaging learning environments for their students. We all know that teachers spend so much of their own money because they love their students.

For the past several years, the H.S.A. has made a strong commitment to funding the school's technology improvement initiative. They have purchased carts of Chromebooks, teacher lap tops, interactive whiteboards as well as contributing to our new fiber optic connection to wifi. Thanks to them we are 1:1 with technology in grades 5-8.

Field trips are another area supported by the H.S.A. Buses to transport students can cost more than \$10,000 for the school each year. For the last several years we have even doubled up classes for trips in order to save money. Thanks to this group, our students don't have to pay a bus fee for these educational experiences.

The annual school auction tends to be the Home and School Association's most profitable fundraiser for the entire school year. This year's theme is Havana Nights complete with Cuban food and entertainment. Your attendance will be directly impacting student life at our amazing school.
