We are so excited to be your homeroom teachers! Please purchase the items below before the start of the school year. **Supplies may have to be repurchased if you need more throughout the year.**

### A supplies case/ pencil box that holds the following items:

- Scissors
- Markers, colored pencils, and/or crayons
- Highlighters
- Pencils (#2): 24
- Pencil cap erasers
- Pink erasers
- Pens black or blue (for assignments), red, orange or green (for correcting assignments)
- Pack of glue sticks
- 12 Dry erase markers and 1 eraser
- Pencil sharpener (no battery-powered sharpeners, please)
