To Jesus through Mary Virtue of the Month – Faith

In a recent visit to an elementary school, Bishop Malooly inquired of third graders what they were learning in various subjects. In English Language Arts the students replied they were learning about verbs. If we recall our knowledge of verbs, we may remember that verbs are *action* words. The tense of the verb may be *past*, *present*, or *future*. An action verb with a direct object is *transitive* while an action verb with no direct object is intransitive. Our faith life is similar to verbs. For our faith life to be alive, we must be *active* – in prayer, in worship, in service. While we can recall past action or anticipate future action, it is the *present* where our focus is most necessary. What am I doing in the here and now that connects me with my faith? Hopefully, our action in faith is always *transitive*, that is, there is a receiver who benefits by coming into contact with us.

Certainly, our model of faith – Mary – was active, present, and transitive. How can we live these characteristics of verbs this week in our lives?

Volunteering

As part of expectations for enrollment each family is required to complete at least 30 hours of volunteering. SCHOOL UNIFORMS

Please make sure you read the section of the student handbook regarding your child's grade level. There are slight differences. For example: PreK students should be wearing sneakers every day, and their walking shorts or pants are to be elastic. Belts are too difficult for them to manage.

CHROME BOOKS

If your student is in grades 6-8, we strongly urge you to get a **cover** to protect their assigned Chrome Book. These are school property and need to be used with the utmost care in order to return it in good condition at the end of the year. This is also a great way to personalize the equipment in order to distinguish it from others.

Aftercare Info.

We have a very busy aftercare program this year. Each day students get a drink and a snack. Afterwards they work on homework before they can play.

Parents should understand that while our staff does facilitate the homework process, this isn't a tutoring program. Students should show parents their homework when they get home for added support.
