To Jesus through Mary March Focus – Sorrowful Mysteries March Virtue of the Month – Mercy

The fourth Sorrowful Mystery of the rosary – Carrying the Cross – reminds us of a common bond of our humanity. Each of us, like Jesus, carries a cross. One cannot look at another's cross and make a judgment about its complexity, difficulty, or worth. For each person the weight of the cross is unique and presents an overwhelming burden. It is in looking to our Savior that we see the manner in which to carry our cross – with humility, in silence, with trust. While we would desire our cross to be lightened, to be resolved, or to disappear entirely, we submit to the belief that God knows the good that will emerge from this trial and will support us to the end. This week, let us pause and ponder the manner in which we embrace the cross that comes to us.

# From the Principal

<u>School Start Time-</u>Be reminded that students who enter the school building after 8:10 are tardy as stipulated in the student handbook on page 1. Teachers bring students inside at 8:05. In the younger grades, students get unpacked before moving to morning community meeting. Please understand that the consequence for more than 4 tardies is recess detention. (page 2) Students who enter late are to report to the main office to check in and get a tardy slip for their homeroom teacher.

<u>Standardized Testing-</u>This year our school in alignment with Diocesan expectations will not be participating in the week long Terra Nova testing as we have in the past. Instead, we are moving to a benchmark assessment, the first of which will be given in late April. These tests are given 3 to 4 times per year and focus on reading and math. <u>Uniform Swap-</u> There will be a uniform swap on Tuesday, March 27<sup>th</sup> from 3:15-6:00pm and again on Wednesday, March 28<sup>th</sup> from 12:00 am -1:00pm in the HSA room on the third floor. Remember that we will switch to the spring uniforms upon our return from Easter break. Please leave your bag of returns (include your family name on it) in the office, and credit slips will be sent home with your youngest student.* 

<u>School Uniforms-</u>We will be switching vendors for our school uniforms. Landsend will be our provider for uniforms and most of our spirit wear. We are finalizing the shopping list and it will be available soon. This

company will give us 6% cash back and if you purchase with a Landsend scrip card, we will get an additional 16% as well. Don't panic! We are not changing colors or plaid, etc. A few items may be slightly different in style and we will add several choices especially in middle school. Students may continue to wear current inventory from the swap.
