April Focus – Glorious Mysteries

April Virtue of the Month – Justice

The first Glorious Mystery – the Resurrection – is found in all four Gospels. It is the pinnacle of our Christian life wherein we are assured of our salvation because of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. While the Gospel accounts of this event offer us many opportunities for reflection, a Scripture verse that is a point of pause for me is found in the Gospel of St. Mark. There, the question is asked by the holy women on their way to the tomb, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb (Mark 16:3)?" Of course, no one needed to remove the stone for them for Jesus had risen! In my life there are stones that prevent me from drawing close to the Lord and to others. Sometimes I think these stones are too large, too difficult, too stubborn, or too many to remove and I become discouraged. If I could only remember that I do not need to remove the stones by myself. Just as the Lord's resurrection removed the stone separating him from the holy women coming to the tomb, the same can happen for me. The risen Jesus can remove the stones blocking my way to him and to others. I need only trust in him. This week let us think about the stones keeping us from Jesus or others. In prayer, let us ask the Lord to roll back these stones.

# From the Principal

<u>Life Crisis-</u> Each year we partner with this great organization to end abuse of children. Students will enjoy a blue NUT day on Friday, April 27<sup>th</sup> as we harvest the pinwheels that we planted last week. Don't forget to bring in \$5 for your own pinwheel to place in your yard to bring awareness to family abuse in our community.

<u>ACRE assessment</u>- Today our 5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders participated in the ACRE assessment, the Assessment of Children's Religious Education. This is an important tool to measure our progress toward achieving the standards set forth by the catechism of the Catholic church.

Benchmark Standardized Testing-This week students have been preparing to take an online standardized test that will replace the Terra Nova Assessments. We are excited about the opportunities Renaissance's Star assessments will bring. These assessments will help to support our longstanding commitment to academic excellence. The research-proven Star Early Literacy, Star Reading, and Star Math assessments quickly provide comprehensive insight into student performance, and provide teachers with the tools they need to bridge assessment and instruction. Each student receives a tailor-made test that adapts to the student's current

performance level, regardless if that performance level is at, above, or below grade level. Question difficulty increases after a correct answer and decreases after an incorrect answer. This reduces testing frustration and allows the test to accurately pinpoint what each student knows and can do. Next week students will take the reading assessment and the math section will be taken the following week. Unlike Terra Novas this test takes less than one hour for each sub test to complete so there is less disruption of regular instructional time. Look for more details next week.
